### Foresthill Road Pipeline Replacement Project is in Service



Foresthill appreciates all the cooperation during this important project to revitalize the public water system. The project replaced 6,700 feet of 1950's era steel pipe from Mosquito Ridge Road to Thomas Street. The improvements will make sure we are ready to serve your daily needs and ready to fight fire. The project, including new fire hydrants and upgraded pipes, was funded in part by revenue earned from the 2020 Water Transfer.

Restoration of the paving is scheduled for spring 2023. Foresthill Road will be completely repaired when conditions will result in quality paving repairs.

**Check irrigation systems.**

Fully drain the system and make sure everything is turned off.

**Check for freezing points.**

Areas around the home that are prone to freezing: crawl spaces, unheated rooms, garages, and exterior walls.

**Protect your pipes.**

Wrapping exposed pipes with insulation or heat tape will protect them in the harsh temperatures.

**Air sealing plumbing and piping.**

Sealing around all exterior pipe openings to prevent cold airflow.

**Turn up the thermostat.**

Keep your house warm even when you aren't home.

**A gallon of water when frozen expands in volume by 9%**
