Working Through The Mosquito Fire



Foresthill's water remained safe during the Mosquito Fire. Operators stayed onsite to keep the water treatment plant running to provide a continuous supply of safe water throughout the fire. The Mosquito Fire was one of the largest wildfires in Placer County history, totaling 76,788 Acres.

Know What's Below, Call Before You Dig!











- **1.** Call 811 or go to Call811.com a few days before digging to request that buried utilities in your yard be marked.
- 2. Wait a few days for all utilities to respond to your request.
- **3.** Confirm that all utilities have responded.
- 4. Respect the utility marks or flags.
- 5. Dig carefully around buried utilities.
