How to Thaw Frozen Pipes

Locate the frozen pipe

Turn on each faucet. If no water comes out or only a trickle, that indicates a potential freeze.

Open the faucets

Open both hot and cold spigots to relieve pressure.

Work from the faucet in


Warm the pipes closer to the faucet to avoid water pressure from a cleared section of pipe hitting a frozen area and putting pressure on the pipe.

Do not use open flames

Heating tape from the hardware store, hair dryers, heat lamps, portable space heaters, and hot towel wraps can be used to thaw pipes. Follow safety precautions for each device. Sometimes, just turning up the heat and warming your home can do it. An infrared lamp may thaw a pipe through a wall if you know where the blockage is.

Get the help of a plumber

If you are uncertain about what to do or are not able to clear the frozen line. There is a risk of fire and burst pipes from thawing frozen pipes, so be cautious.
