When Crisis Strikes Foresthill Doesn't Quit



Foresthill Public Utility District assisted the management at Hillcrest Mobile Home Park with repairs to their water system. Hillcrest called Foresthill to schedule a shutdown of their system to perform a water line repair on March 19. Foresthill responded by standing by while repairs were completed. At approximately 7 PM, the repair failed and Foresthill was able to prevent damage by closing appropriate valves to the mobile home

park. The residents of the park were without water all night, so Foresthill delivered water to each resident the morning of March 20. Repairs were completed by Hillcrest by noon March 20 and water service was restored at that time.

Foresthill partnered with Worton's Grocery to secure the water for residents.

Foresthill Teams up with PG&E for Fire Prevention



Foresthill is working in coordination with PG&E and PG&E contractors to avoid water main breaks by marking our facilities at work sites for the coming PG&E underground project. A blue mark on the ground/pavement indicates the location of a water main or service line. In the coming months you may see field staff marking water lines near the front of your property or in the road more often than usual. Foresthill regularly checks for USA's (Underground Service Alerts) and respond as quickly as possible to avoid conflict. It is always good practice for contractors, home owners, tenants, and other utility companies to call 811 before doing any underground project even at your own residence to avoid hitting public utilities. Calling 811 is always a free service and every dig requires a call!

Filter Inspection Completed by Foresthill

The annual filter inspections were completed by Foresthill staff in early March. Annual inspections are necessary to keep the water treatment plant running properly. It is particularly important to complete these inspections early to avoid high flows through the plant during the summer and fire seasons. The filters received and A+ and are ready for summer service!
